

## JFK PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

**Note:** New York City subways and busses are not equipped for large pieces of luggage. Please plan for this contingency if you plan to use public transportation upon your arrival at JFK.

### New York City Transit

**Subway and Long Island Rail Road** - Connect to and from AirTrain JFK at:

- LIRR at Jamaica Station
- A subway at Howard Beach/JFK Airport Station
- E, J/Z subway at Stphn Blvd.-Archer Ave., Jamaica Station
- NYC Transit Bus Lines at Jamaica Station: Q20, Q24, Q30, Q31, Q43, Q44, Q54
- Green Bus Lines at Jamaica Station: Q6, Q8, Q9, Q40, Q41, Q60

**Subway "A":** (718) 330-1234. Operated by New York City Transit. For subway service to Queens, Brooklyn and Manhattan, take the AirTrain from all JFK terminals to the Howard Beach Subway Station where passengers board the "A" train. Stops are made throughout Queens, Brooklyn, Manhattan and the Bronx. Passengers traveling from Manhattan or Brooklyn to JFK should use the "A" train going to Far Rockaway. Fare is \$2.00 (Cash, token, or Metrocard). Travel time is approximately 60-75 minutes from JFK to mid-Manhattan.



**Note: Free transfer between bus and subway available.**

**Q10Bus:** (718) 995-4700. Operated by Green Bus Line for local service to Queens. Connect to NYC subway trains A, E, F and R at Lefferts Blvd. And Kew Gardens. Fare is \$2.00 (exact change required).

**Q3 Bus:** (718) 330-1234. Operated by New York City Transit for local service to Queens. Connect at 169th St. and Hillside Ave. for NYC subway trains F and R. Fare

is \$2.00 (exact change required).

**B15 Bus:** (718) 330-1234. Operated by New York City Transit for local service to East New York, Brooklyn. Connect at New Lots and Livonia Aves. For NYC subway trains 3 and 4. Fare is \$2.00 (exact change required).

## KENNEDY AIRPORT

Via the Subway and AirTrain JFK



### Howard Beach AirTrain station

The stops at Howard Beach every 5 to 10 minutes during rush hours and every 15 to 20 minutes evenings and weekends. AirTrain stops at Howard Beach every 4 to 10 minutes.

Most subway lines connect to the . Just be sure you take the marked "Far Rockaway", **NOT** "Lefferts Boulevard". It's about a 12-minute ride from Howard Beach station to the airport. The AirTrain fare is \$5 and is in addition to the subway fare. You can pay the AirTrain fare with a Pay-Per-Ride MetroCard. (\$2+\$5=\$7)



### Jamaica AirTrain station

trains all stop at the Sutphin Boulevard station in Jamaica where you connect to the AirTrain Jamaica station. trains run every 5 to 10 minutes during rush hours and 8 to 12 minutes evenings and weekends. AirTrain travels to the airport from Jamaica every 4 to 10 minutes. The AirTrain ride to the airport takes about 12 minutes. The AirTrain fare is \$5 and is in addition to the subway fare. You can pay the AirTrain fare with a Pay-Per-Ride MetroCard.

### At Long Island Rail Road Jamaica station (LIRR)

You can connect to AirTrain at the LIRR Jamaica station.

## The subway or the Long Island Rail Road and AirTrain are the new, fast, economical ways to JFK International Airport.

AirTrain is a light-rail system that links the Howard Beach  and the Sutphin Boulevard    subway stations, and LIRR's Jamaica Station directly to JFK. It takes about an hour from most parts of the city, and about 15 minutes from LIRR's Jamaica Station — with no traffic or parking worries ever.

And just like the subway, AirTrain runs 24/7.




AirTrain stations are fully enclosed, heated in winter, air conditioned in summer; they're ADA compliant, with wide escalators and glass-enclosed elevators. At the airport, convenient moving walkways take you and your luggage to any one of nine connecting airline terminals. Some airlines will check you in and take your luggage at Jamaica Station before you board AirTrain.

### The Fare







Travel to and from JFK via AirTrain is \$5 each way. Children under 5 ride free. You pay the fare with Pay-Per-Ride MetroCard at either the Sutphin Boulevard or Howard Beach station (unlimited ride cards are not accepted for AirTrain).

Be sure you add additional money to your Pay-Per-Ride MetroCard to cover the cost for the subway and AirTrain.

### At the Howard Beach station

The  train stops at Howard Beach every 5 to 10 minutes during rush hours and every 15 to 20 minutes evenings and weekends. AirTrain stops at Howard Beach every 4 to 10 minutes. Most subway lines connect to the  train. Just be sure you take the  marked "Far Rockaway," **NOT** "Lefferts Boulevard." It's about a 12-minute ride from the Howard Beach station to the airport.

### At the Sutphin Boulevard station in Jamaica

   trains all stop at the Sutphin Boulevard station where you connect to the AirTrain Jamaica Stop.    trains run every 5 to 10 minutes during rush hours and 8 to 12 minutes evenings and weekends. AirTrain travels to the airport from Jamaica every 4 to 10 minutes and the trip takes no longer than 12 minutes.
